Professional Women Duckpin Bowlers to Compete for Largest Prize List in History

BALTIMORE, Maryland, March 8, 2010—The Women's National Duckpin Association (WNSA) announces that the opening event of their 2010 tournament season will have a \$5,000 first prize, making it the highest paying women's duckpin bowling competition in history. The event will take place at Turner's Dual Lanes in Hagerstown, Maryland, from May 28 to May 30, 2010.

The WNSA event will be held concurrently with the Duckpin Professional Bowlers Association (DPBA) event. These two competitions will be collectively known as the "2010 Duckpin Olympics". This is made possible through a sponsorship from Hagerstown businessman Frank Turner. "I want this to be the premier event in duckpin bowling," says Frank Turner, CEO of Turner Enterprises. "Duckpin bowlers, men and women alike, will come from all over the country to compete for these record-setting prize lists."

Several local bowlers from Glen Burnie and the surrounding area, including #9 nationally ranked John Deantonis, are expected to compete and be favorites for the top prizes.
