SCHREIBER SHINES IN NATIONAL DUCKPIN TOURNAMENT

Baltimore Bowler, Lauree Schreiber, Captures Third Victory

Glen Burnie, Maryland - It was an exciting weekend for duckpin Hall of Famer Lauree Schreiber of Abingdon, Maryland as the Baltimore bowler emerged as the latest Women's National Duckpin Association (WNDA) Pro Tour champion.

The third event of the WNDA Pro Tour took place on July 10-11 at Glen Burnie Bowl, located in Glen Burnie, Maryland. The tournament consisted of a qualifying round on Saturday, divisional playoffs on Sunday, and concluded with a head-to-head elimination round. Many of the top women bowlers from across the US and Canada participated in this event.

At the conclusion of Saturday's qualifying round, twenty four participants advanced to the divisional playoffs. The qualifying score needed advance to Sunday's divisional playoffs was 1024 or better. **Kendra Boswell** of **Portsmouth, Virginia**, was the top qualifier with a score of 1202, which included the **weekend's only 200 game** of 208. Schreiber rolled a score of 1070 for her initial eight games, allowing her to advance to Sunday's matches.

In the divisional play-offs, Schreiber was unstoppable. She easily clinched her division by winning 4 of her 5 matches and averaging over 166 per game. The winners of each division, along with a wild-card, are seeded on a ladder based on their record. Schreiber's record, combined with her outstanding score of 821, placed her as the number one seed.

In the first ladder match, **Kristy Penny** of **Sparrows Point, MD**, who had grabbed the wild card spot, had to face off against #4 seed **Kendra Boswell**. Both ladies put up great scores, but Boswell edged out Penny, 150-138.

In the second match, Boswell now had to face #3 seeded **Jill Sachs** of **Eldersburg, Maryland**. Both Sachs and Boswell were quite familiar with the intensity of the ladder matches. At the first tournament of the 2010 season, Boswell was eliminated in her second ladder match and finished third. In June, at the second event of the year, Sachs was defeated in her third game and also placed third. In yet another impressive competition, Sachs put up a score of 137 but was conquered by Boswell's 152 game.

It was evident that Boswell was on a mission to win. Her next opponent was #2 seed **Adele Asimenios** of **Baltimore, Maryland**. Both women are veterans of the sport and have won a combined eleven Pro Tours. Boswell continued her remarkable streak and outscored Asimenios by 70 pins.

It was now time for the final game of the weekend, and Boswell, now in her 17th game of the tournament, was up against top-seeded Schreiber. Both women put up a fight, but Schreiber pulled ahead to claim the win, 158-127. The conclusion of this tournament gave Schreiber her third tour victory and a cash prize of \$1000. Schreiber's mom, who was celebrating her birthday, along with her husband and son were all on-hand to witness her accomplishment.

The fourth stop on the 2010 WNDA Pro Tour will take place at Town Hall Lanes, in Johnston, RI, on August 6-8.
